## Coping with COVID-19

We asked three staff members to share with us how they are getting along during the pandemic.

**Margaret Sebelebele**, Care Worker, has been coping with the pandemic by following all the rules and instructions from medical schemes which are to wash hands well and sanitise all the time, to wear a mask and to keep a distance from others. It has been most difficult to keep a distance from relatives and friends, to not feel free to go to the shops and to not attend funerals and other functions. She learned that no matter how much time we think we have, we are not the ones to decide on what will happen tomorrow. She sees her biggest blessing as still being alive and not having faced infection in her immediate family.



**Nancy Mamabolo**, Staff Nurse, has also been coping by maintaining good hygiene at home and at work. For her the most difficult part has been the fear of being exposed or exposing others to the COVID-19 virus. She finds it difficult to work during the pandemic because she is so scared for her health and for the people she supports. She has learnt to make every moment count because life is short, and we never know what tomorrow brings. She sees her biggest blessings as being healthy and employed in a time where so many people have become ill or lost their jobs. She sees herself as incredibly fortunate and she is grateful that so far, her family has been spared those hardships.



**Chantell Kriel**, Administrator, has been coping well. She has begun to rely on on-line shopping for groceries, pharmacy products, etc. If it is extremely necessary to go into a shop, she makes sure that she is there when they open so that she will not be exposed to crowds of people. At work she has had to adapt to greeting people in a different way. She is not using the elbow greet anymore and she just hopes that people are able to see her smile through her eyes. She has had to come to terms with the impersonal touch. It has been most difficult to limit physical contact with her family and those she interacts with. She loves hugging her kids and their better halves, and hugging people in general, and she has had to fight the urge to hug someone when they need it. She has learnt to never take her health for granted, and to be grateful for those little aches and pains, and for small, joyous moments. She feels that focusing on the negativity around us may make us forget that the small moments can become our biggest memories. Her biggest blessing is her recovery from the Covid-19 infection.

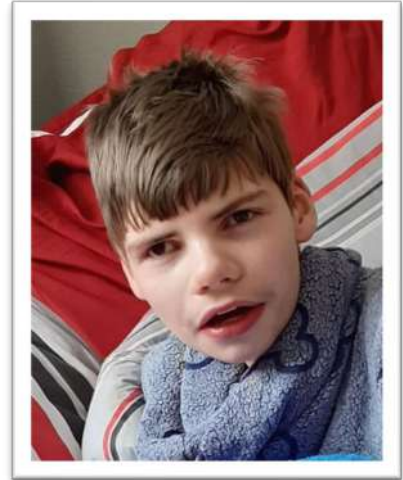
