
Casa Caritas 50th Birthday Celebrations

The late Mrs. Joan Muller founded the Home in 1973 and became the first CEO. Her son, Cornel Muller (right) reminisced about those humble early beginnings with eight day-visitors in the Maxwell Street House. Initially known as Kempton Park Home for the Disabled, the name was later changed to Casa Caritas and in 1985 the Home moved to its current premises in De Villiers Street where it has developed from strength to strength. 
Fire at Casa Caritas

On Thursday afternoon 19 October 2023, our garage caught fire. The Kempton Park Fire Department arrived within 15 minutes and contained the fire to the garage only.

Our residents were evacuated to the safety of the Maggie Coetzee Lapa within 5 minutes of sounding the fire alarm. We are grateful for the safety drills which prepared our staff to act swiftly to protect the residents. Our staff was debriefed by trauma counsellors on Monday 23 October.

Members of our community were on the scene within minutes and assisted us until late in the evening. They helped us to move and make beds for residents who could not return to their rooms for the night due to the potential risk of smoke inhalation.

Our second-hand shop, Something Blue, and our nappy/clothing store unfortunately took a beating through smoke and water damage. Our shop will be closed until further notice for repairs and restoration.



At the time of preparing this edition of Casa News the management team was still waiting on the official report from the Kempton Park Fire Department.

We are issuing thank you letters to everyone from the Greater Kempton Park community who came to our assistance after the fire. We tried to record all the names and numbers – if you do not receive a thank you, please bear with us. The days following the fire were chaotic. We appreciate and value absolutely everyone who came and who contributed and had us in their thoughts. We are humbled by your concern and generosity.

To everyone who came to assist us with our residents in the Lapa, thank you.

To everyone who donated water, nappies and groceries, thank you.

To everyone who assisted us with our laundry, thank you.

To everyone who lent us fans and sprayed the home with disinfectant spray, thank you.

To everyone that made donations toward fire restoration costs, thank you.

To the trauma counsellors that were here on the evening, thank you.

The nappies that were donated on the evening of the fire was a life saver after our stock got soaked. Cash donations further helped to replenish the stock. The residents' clothing and linen was soiled by smoke and water. Community members who assisted with laundry helped us tremendously to be up and running again. We asked for drinking water to keep the volunteers on the evening hydrated and we were overwhelmed by the amount of water that was received.

Kempton Park, we thank you and we salute you!

On behalf of the parents, I would like to thank Chantell Kriel and her team of Casa Caritas employees who worked relentlessly to create and implement a contingency plan. You worked extremely long hours to keep our loved ones safe. To our Chairman Mark Naidoo and his wife Bunny who worked side-by-side with the Casa Caritas team, thank you. God bless all of you.


